RETIRED FALCON NAMED TO CSA HALL OF FAME

I was recently asked by a member of the Falcon's Executive to write a few words about Eric King, a longtime member and average player, of the Oldtimers Strollers Team. Eric was a regular member of the team and a favourite of the Coach, I will use that term loosely, Davie Hart. It was more due to his "Englishness" than his ability that he was a regular starter on the left side of the team forcing the fleet footed Eugene Marotta to the substitute's bench.

I played with Eric on the Strollers team for almost ten years and I have spent the last two weeks trying to remember when he displayed a moment of brilliance on the field.....it's not come back to me yet!!! He did win the Most Valuable Player one year.....but then again Hart has never released the performance indicators he uses to select the winner.

Eric recently announced his retirement from the Coaching Association of Canada where he was the Vice-president of Operations and Marketing. Prior to that Eric was, for many years, the Executive Director of the Canadian Soccer Association and oversaw the growth of the game throughout Canada. Eric worked for many years in the Ottawa soccer

community both with the EODSA and the OSA, and brought his expertise to these organisations. Eric is staying involved as Chairman of the Organising Committee for this year's Mens University Soccer Championships at Carleton.

Eric was recently invoked into the Canadian Soccer Association Hall of Fame for his long time commitment to the game.

IT'S TRUE! REFS PICK ON'BAD BOYS'

Reputations for ill-discipline do count when referees dish out red and yellow cards, according to the results of new research published today.

A study undertaken by the Staffordshire University indicated that match officials were 50 per cent more likely to caution or send off players from teams perceived to have poor records for aggressive or foul play.

Arsenal and Leeds, two of the most punished clubs in the Premiership, have already complained this season that they are being treated unfairly.

Gunners vice-chairman David Dein and United boss David O'Leary have also suggested that their teams are subject to an 'agenda' in on-pitch disciplinary matters, an accusation strongly refuted by referees.

Researchers split 38 referees into two groups, showing them 50 video clips of incidents from football games involving a team in a blue strip.

Both groups were given written instructions but only one was told that the 'blue' team present in all the clips had a reputation for committing fouls and aggression.

For each incident, participants were asked to indicate if they believed a foul had occurred and what action they would take if refereeing the game.

The research, conducted by Marc Jones and his University team, showed that when referees were told of the blue team's reputation they came down significantly harder on their players.

In a summary of the findings presented at the British Psychological Society's annual conference in Blackpool today, the researchers said: 'Prior knowledge may impact referees' behaviour and these findings are of relevance to other situations where individuals have to make important decisions under time pressure.'
